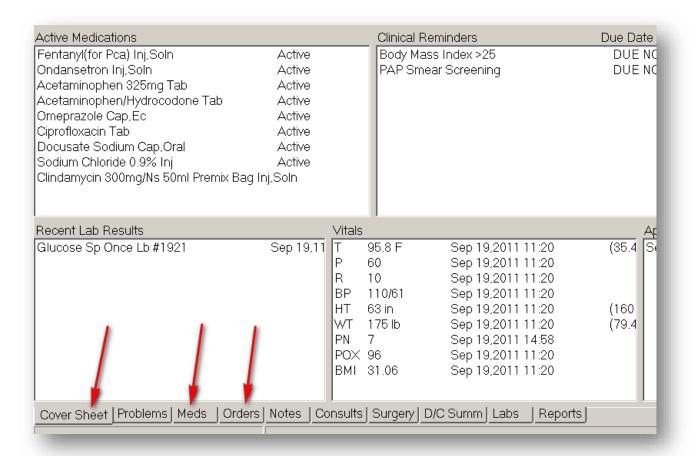


Quick Guide to Barcoding Medications

The first step to barcoding medications in the EHR is to select and open a patient chart, order the desired medication(s) and sign your orders.

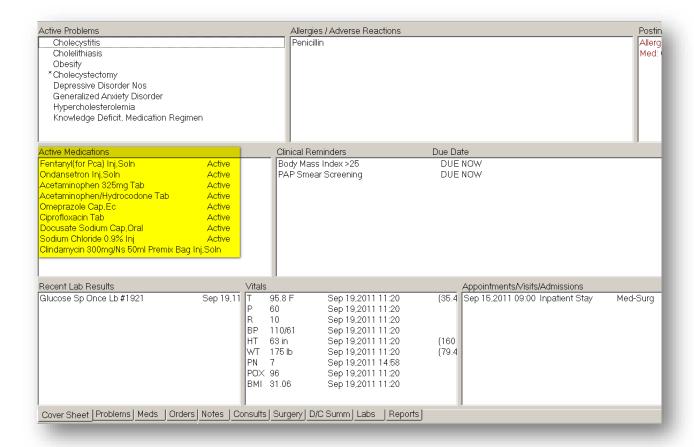
Once signed, a **File > Refresh** should activate your orders. Only active orders will be ready to administer in the eMAR.

Active medication orders will appear on the Cover Sheet, the Meds Tab and the Orders Tab.



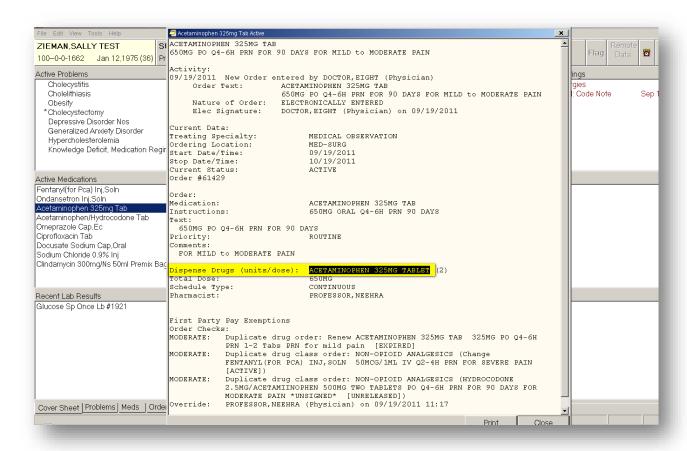


Double click on any active medication order to view the Order Detail.





The Order Detail report will tell you exactly which medication has been dispensed.



The Dispense Drugs (units/dose) detail is the exact medication needed for your barcode.

Highlight this drug name and dose and press **Ctrl+C** to copy it to your clipboard.

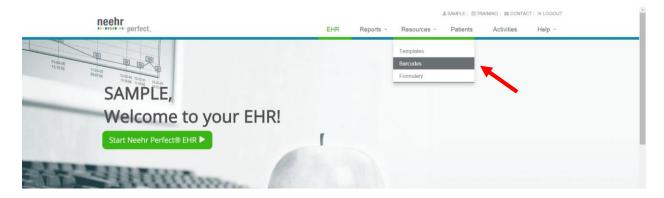
Close the Order Detail window by clicking on the **X** in the top right corner or pressing the **Close** button in the bottom right corner of the report screen.



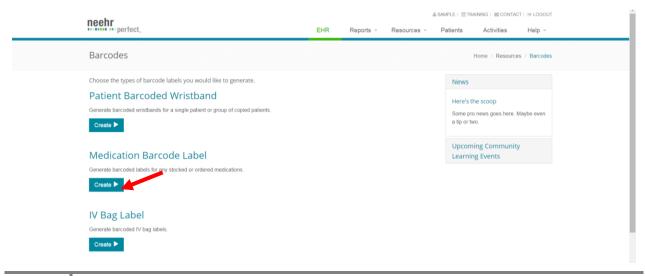
Return to the Faculty Collaboration Network.



Select Resources then Barcodes.

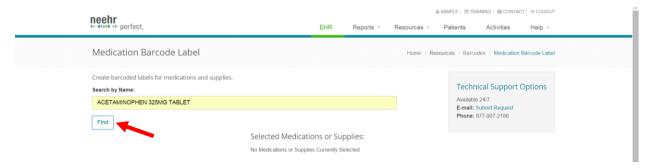


Then select Create for Medication Barcode Label

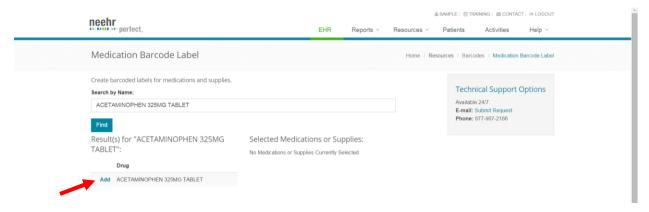




In the Medication Barcode Generator tool, under Search by Name, put your cursor in the search box and paste (either right click and choose **paste** or press **Ctrl+V** to paste to drug name, then click **Find**.

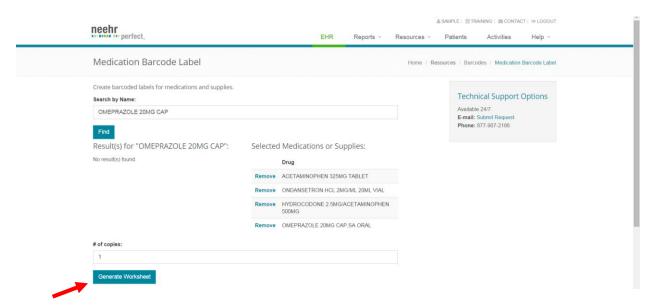


The Barcode Search will return an exact match for your ordered medication. Press **Add**. Note: If more than one result is returned, select Add for the one that exactly matches the dispense drug you entered.



Repeat with your other medications and when finished, press **Generate Worksheet** to create the barcoded labels.



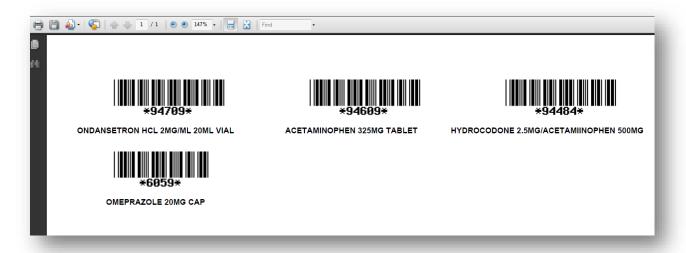


Press **Generate Label Sheet** to create a PDF that can be saved, printed on plain paper, or printed on Avery 5260 label paper for peel-off barcode labels.



The finished PDF label sheet will look something like this:
